# 60,000 DONATED SCHOOL BOOKS BEING DISTRIBUTED IN SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT INDONESIA

FCI volunteers have been distributing school books to schools across Indonesia including Atambua and Kupang on Timor Island; Ruteng, Ende and Reo, Flores Island; Palu, Sulawesi; Bogor, Marunda and Pulau, Sembilangan; Sukabumi, Cibadak and the greater Jakarta area. In some of the schools the children had never had their own copies of books but rather there was only one copy per school so the children needed to write out the work by hand. In many of the schools the children were so happy that they sang and performed for FCI volunteers as they arrived with the books.
