This month Esther and friends visited SDN (Sekolah Dasar Negeri) Cikoneng, Desa Tugu Utara in **Cisarua, Puncak**. The school is located in the middle of the mountainous tea plantation. Our friend who invited FCI volunteers to visit the school also organized the day for the students and teachers to do a program of cleaning, sweeping and picking-up trash in the surrounding area of the school. As a part of the program trash bins were donated and placed around the school to encourage people who live in the village to keep the area clean by throwing trash in the bins rather than on the ground or on the side of the streets. After the clean-up, FCI volunteers distributed colored pencils, small bags and snacks for all the students and teachers. Our friend also provided lunch boxes for the students and teachers which we all enjoyed together.
