Since Esther, one of our volunteers in Indonesia is from the Philippines, she decided to go and help in one of the most devastated areas, Tacloban City. For 10 days, Esther joined local Family Care volunteers from "The Channel of Hope Foundation" who were based in R.T. Romualdez Hospital. Our main involvement was in distributing water, food packages, thousands of mats, sheets and to offer comfort to those we met. Volunteers in Manila continue with this effort as more volunteers are arriving from other parts of the world.
